

AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS

I, Cliff Paine, move to amend the By-Laws of North Florida Corvette Association, Incorporated as follows:

Article V, Section 1, <u>Number and Term of Directors</u> to be changed to read as follows:

"Section 1. Number and Term of Directors. The business, property and affairs of this corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors composed of six persons who shall be the duly elected officers of this corporation. Each director shall hold office until his successor is elected and qualified."

Article VI, Section 1, Officers to be changed to read:

"Section 1. Officers. The officers of the corporation shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Sergeant at Arms and Governor."

A new paragraph to be added at the end of Article VI, Section 6, to read as follows:

"f. Governor:

- 1. To be a member of the Board of Directors.
- 2. To handle all National Council business for the corporation."
- I, Larry O'Steen, move to amend the By-Laws of North Florida Corvette Association, Incorporated, namely Article IV, Section 1, to be changed to read:

"Section 1. Annual Meeting. The annual meeting of the membership of this corporation shall be held on the first Wednesday in January of each year at 2600 Phillips Highway, Jacksonville, Florida."
